ANAPHYLAXIS INFORMATION

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that can become life threatening, causing airways to close, swelling, numbress, etc., and leads to a coma and death if not immediately treated. While anaphylaxis is usually brought on by insect bites, exposure to peanuts, tree nuts, dairy products and latex, there are many other triggers. An anaphylactic reaction can be tempered by the immediate injection of adrenalin in the form of an EpiPen. The classrooms with students with specific allergies have a notice sent home regarding the classroom being a specific peanut/nut aware zone. It is important to us at Mountain View Elementary School that all our students remain safe and healthy, so please take the time to speak with your student about the seriousness of anaphylaxis. WELCOME TO KINDERGARTEN

The "Welcome to Kindergarten" orientation for children registered to begin Kindergarten at Mountain View in September 2019 is on **Thursday, May 23 from 9:15 – 10:45 am** in the gym. The Kindergarten teachers will share fun activities that you can do at home with your child to assist in being Kindergarten ready. Invitations will be going out by email at the end of April to students that are **in catchment and are registered in our centralized e-registration** for September 2019 at Mountain View. **Please ensure that you register prior to June 15, 2019 for September 2019 to ensure that there is a space.**

ELECTRONIC CENTRAL REGISTRATION FOR SCHOOL

To register your child in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools, the online, centralized registration began on January 9, 2019. The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you.

Take a moment and ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
- 2. Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2019 that will be entering Kindergarten? Applications must be received by June 15, 2019 to ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.
- 3. Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2019, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2019. Late French Immersion students are placed as space permits.
- 5. Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? (Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball, Lacrosse, Baseball, Performing Arts or Jazz)? Applications will be received until March 1, 2019, at which time student selection will be determined by either lottery or tryout/audition. Parents will be notified in May 2019.
- 6. Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)? Applications are due March 31, 2019.

MEASLES – Update from VIHA

The Province of British Columbia is launching a measles immunization catch-up program to help B.C. families to ensure their children are protected from measles. The program will run from April through June 2019, with a goal of immunizing as many of the under immunized school aged children as possible by the end of the school year. Immunization consent packages will be sent home for students in kindergarten to grade 4 who are behind on their immunizations. Students will be offered immunizations at a public health office or a school-based immunization clinic with the consent of a parent, guardian or representative. Parent(s), guardians or representatives will be required to accompany students to the public health immunization appointment or school based immunization clinic. Students who are up to date on their immunizations will receive a record of immunization. Please keep this record to provide to your child's school this fall.

First Nations children who receive health services in their communities may be able to access immunization records and services at their Community Health Centers. Please contact the local Health Unit at 250-755-3388 and ask to speak with a Public Health Nurse if you have any questions. Nanaimo/Ladysmith/Gabriola Public Health is currently organizing immunization clinics for under immunized school aged children. Please watch for further information regarding the dates and locations of these clinics.
