Kindergarten students may borrow one book while students in Grades 1-7 may borrow two, for a one-week loan period. Reminder notices for overdue books will be sent home at the end of the week. There are no fines for overdue books, but a replacement charge is requested for lost or damaged books

Please encourage your child to return or, in the case of students reading longer chapter books, renew, their library books to help their class earn the **On Time Champion Weekly Award**.

The winning class receives school wide recognition on the library bulletin board and the class to receive the most weekly recognitions will earn a prize for all students in the class at the end of the year!

Parent Volunteers

The library is open to students in grades 3-7 Mondays during long recess for reading and quiet schoolwork.

ANAPHYLAXIS INFORMATION

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that can become life threatening, causing airways to close, swelling, numbness, etc., and leads to a coma and death if not immediately treated. While anaphylaxis is usually brought on by insect bites, exposure to peanuts, tree nuts, dairy products and latex, there are many other triggers. An anaphylactic reaction can be tempered by the immediate injection of adrenalin in the form of an EpiPen.

This year, Mountain View Elementary School has several students who are allergic to peanuts and nuts and who may experience anaphylactic reactions. We strongly advise that students learn to be nut aware. The students in classrooms with students with specific allergies have will have a notice sent home regarding the classroom being a specific peanut/nut free zone. It is important to us at Mountain View Elementary School that all our students remain safe and healthy, so please take the time to speak with your student about the seriousness of anaphylaxis. MOUNTAIN VIEW ELECTRONICS POLICY

All student cell phones, smartphones, etc. are to off, stay out of sight and in the student's backpack throughout the school day. *Students may use their phone under the direction of their teacher & with their teacher's permission for their learning.* If a student needs to use a phone during the day, the student phone is available in the office area. If a parent needs to contact a student, please call the office.

Electronic gaming devices are not to be used at school. It is not permissible for students to use electronic devices to video/record other students on the school property or field trips, unless under the direct supervision of their teacher for a learning activity. Electronic devices should only be used in the classroom, under the direct supervision of the teacher, with the teacher's permission for learning activities. Mountain View Elementary School is not responsible for any electronic device that is lost, stolen, or damaged while on school property.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS/BEHAVIOUR

During the first few weeks of a new school year, it is important for students to review and to understand what will be the expected behaviour both in the classroom and on the playground. Throughout the year the following will be emphasized so that a safe and positive learning environment is present.

- **Safety:** Act in a safe and responsible manner.
- **Responsibility:** Develop the use of self-discipline. Achieve your best.
- **Respect:** Recognize and respect the rights of others as well as yourself.

LUNCH HOUR/RECESS EXPECTATIONS

At Mountain View, we have an active playtime at recess and students eat in their classrooms. During the eating time, students will be actively learning as well. Expectations for students during recess are as follows:

- ➤ Play outdoors from 11:44 until 12:20, Monday through Friday. Spending their breaks outside provides students with the opportunity for movement and fresh air.
- Eat lunch in classrooms (this is teacher-supervised instructional time).
- ➤ Very infrequently, on extremely stormy days, we may declare an "inside day", where we will keep students inside during the noon recess.
- ➤ Please encourage your child to dress for all types of weather as we encourage our students to be outside as much as possible.
