As we approach the Holiday Season...

Our school community is dedicated to showing generosity and demonstrating kindness to each other and in our community. We continue to work with our students to model effective tools for self-regulation and ways of solving peer conflict in peaceful kind ways. Our students, with the lead of the staff as well, work to be "bucket fillers"!

There are many ways that our Mountain View students show leadership and are making our school a positive place:

- ✓ The students in Mr. Cronan's division visited classes to lead in PBIS (Positive Behaviour Intervention System), with an emphasis on modelling safe, responsible and respectful behaviour. The students will also be working on speaking to each class about our common expectations for calm alert learning and kind ways to play at recess, including using WITS.
- ✓ Our WE club continues to be outstanding in supporting local and global actions. The students organized a "We Scare Hunger" campaign for Loaves and Fishes. The students raised over \$550 by selling tasty treats around the world to support their action plan.
- ✓ Our Grade 7 students have volunteered to read out the morning announcements, starting the day with a Hul'q'umi'num' welcome, and on Mondays leading the school in "Oh Canada" and leading the Remembrance Day Assembly.

Thank you to the Mountain View staff, parents and volunteers in the community who continue to demonstrate generosity with their time, energy and talent to provide a multitude of learning opportunities. At Mountain View Elementary, we believe in the importance of fresh air and outside play, students will go outside for fresh air at recess breaks unless it is extremely stormy (high winds combined with excessive rainfall). Layered clothing is always a good choice as children can then take off and put on clothing as is necessary. Please label your child's clothing and check the Lost and Found Box regularly.



SCHOOL CLOSURE DUE TO WEATHER

It is that time of year again, when School District staff would like to remind parents about school closure procedures. The most common reasons that schools might be closed are dangerous road conditions due to a heavy snowfall or ice. If you are wondering if schools are open on a particular day and for the most current updates listen to local radio stations (WAVE 102.3 FM and WOLF 106.9 FM) in the mornings. We also attempt to put an announcement of any school closure on the School District website, <u>www.sd68.bc.ca</u>, and on Twitter and Facebook, but our ability to do so could be affected by such things as power outages and technical issues. If there is no announcement on the website or social media, please be sure to listen to local radio stations.

We would like to remind parents that it is their right to make the final decision as to whether it is safe for their children to travel to school on any given day. While the district strives to make the best decision possible for students across the district, there may be circumstances in your neighbourhood that lead you to decide to keep your children home, even though schools are open.

ANAPHYLAXIS INFORMATION

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that can become life threatening, causing airways to close, swelling, numbness, etc., and leads to a coma and death if not immediately treated. While anaphylaxis is usually brought on by insect bites, exposure to peanuts, tree nuts, dairy products and latex, there are many other triggers. An anaphylactic reaction can be tempered by the immediate injection of adrenalin in the form of an EpiPen.

The classrooms with students with specific allergies will have a notice sent home regarding the classroom being a specific peanut/nut aware zone.

It is important to us at Mountain View Elementary School that all our students remain safe and healthy, so please take the time to speak with your student about the seriousness of anaphylaxis.

ELECTRONIC CENTRAL REGISTRATION FOR SCHOOL

To register your child in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools, the online, centralized registration will begin on January 8, 2020 at 8:00 am. The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. Take a moment and ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Is my child **new** to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
- 2. Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2020 that will be entering Kindergarten? Applications must be received by June 15, 2020 to ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.
- 3. Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- 4. Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2020, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2020. Late French Immersion students are placed as space permits.
- 5. Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? Lottery: Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball. Try-Outs/Auditions: Lacrosse, Performing Arts, Jazz. Applications will be received until March 1, 2020, at which time student selection will be determined by either lottery or tryout/audition. Parents will be notified in May 2020.
- 6. Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)? Applications are due March 31, 2020.
